

Prospective Professors in Training (PPIT) Program

The Prospective Professors in Training (PPIT) program prepares PhD students for the rigors of applying to, and holding an academic position. PPIT prepares students to develop all components of an effective academic application package (CV, cover letter, teaching dossier, and research statement), as well as for an academic job interview. Students also learn how early-career academics best manage their time and resources between teaching, research, and university administration duties. Finally, the course APS1203 - Teaching Engineering in Higher Education – is an essential part of the PPIT program.

PPIT participants are expected to complete the program within 12 calendar months, although this timeline may be extended to 24 months depending on a student's schedule.

To be considered for the PPIT program, all candidates must have:

- completed at least the first year of their PhD program;
- completed their qualifying and/or comprehensive exams (or intend to complete by November 1, 2017);
- submitted a completed PPIT application (this document, plus a CV) with the endorsement (signature) of their PhD supervisor;
- have obtained a minimum cumulative GPA of A-.

We can only accommodate a limited number of participants. Applications will be assessed on the basis of academic and research excellence, as judged by the CV, and by the level of interest and the learning expectations of the applicant, as demonstrated in this application.

Application Deadline: Tuesday, September 15, 2017.

All applicants will be notified regarding admission to the program.
